Ideas and help is always appreciated

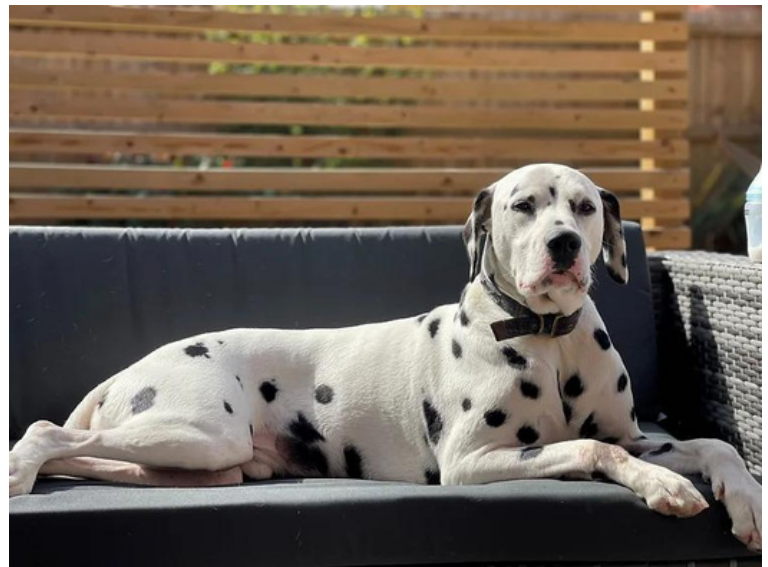
Here are some of the dogs jumping on Sue and a sofa that has been donated

Mum says I am a nutter cos I am a little bit unpredictable I like to make scary noises and want to eat you when I have food.

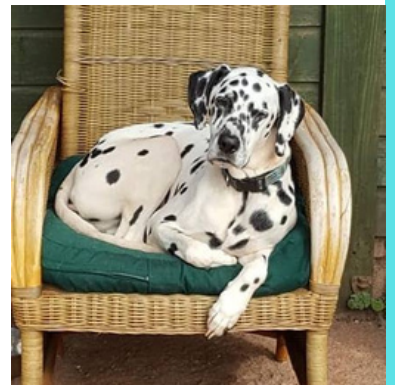
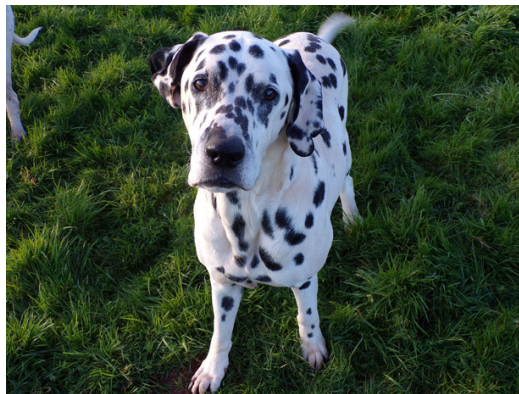
I have an odd shaped skull cos something happened to me when I was a puppya child put it's hand near my food, I didn't bite it though but I got severely beaten and my head was kicked.
